- 1915 – Our first annual dues: \$2.00!
- 1918 - Organized a program to get teachers to work on farms during the summer to produce food for the war effort.
- 1924 – Worked to found cooperative housing for teachers to combat post World War I high rents.
- 1925 – Worked with the Carnegie Foundation to provide pensions and annuities for private school teachers.
- 1930 – Dues: \$3.00
- 1946 – Became a member of National Council of Independent Schools.
- 1951 – First Annual Conference and Exhibit at City & Country School.
- 1962 – Founding Member of the National Association of Independent Schools.
- 1986 – First New Teachers Conference
- 1998 – Membership tops 2,000
- 2004 – Performing artist programs introduced.
